

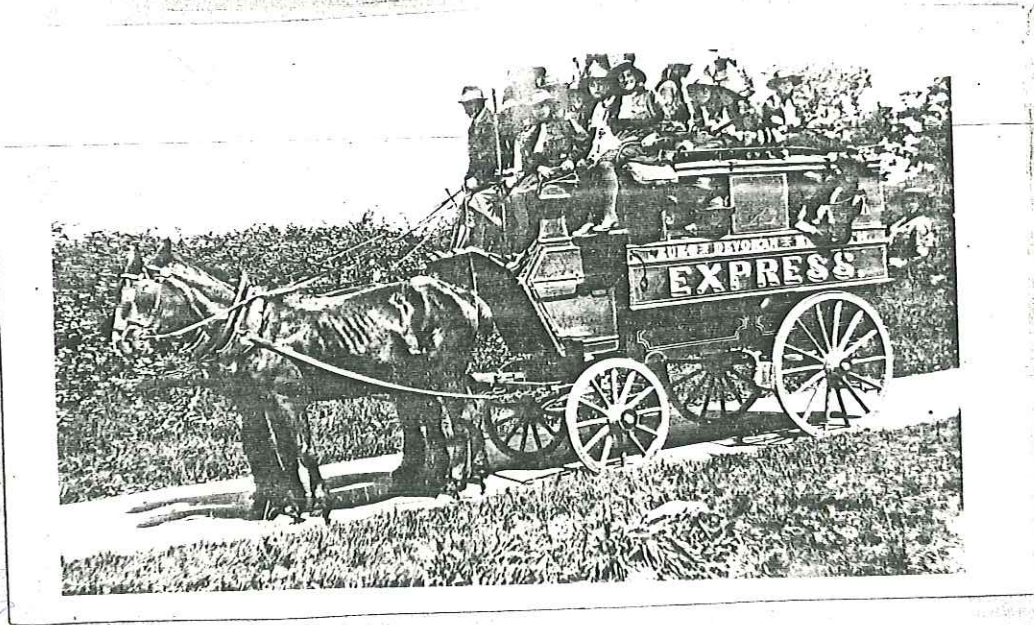
BOYS' BRIGADE

The rooms over the Market Hall were given by the late Lord Clifden to be used for the village and they were known as the "Public Rooms" and all the Concerts and Meetings were held there. After the Village Hall was opened Lord Clifden gave the large room to the Church: it is now known as the Church Room, and the small one for the use of the Guides, as long as there were Guides in Devoran. After they ended it was to go to the Church.

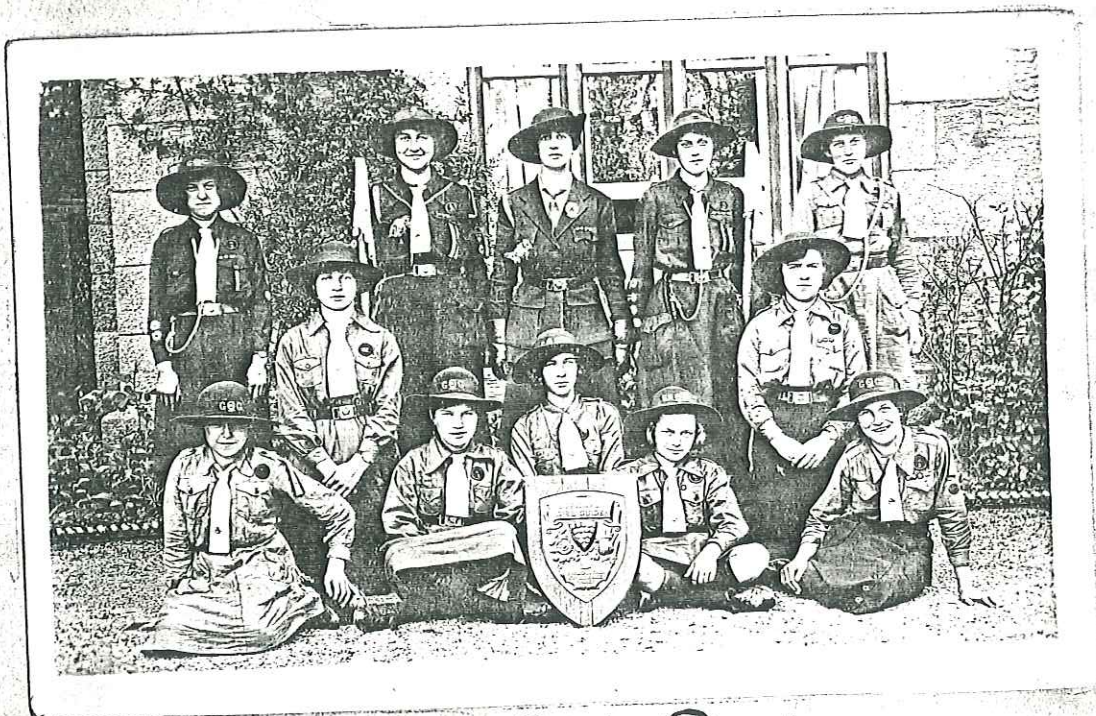
About thirty years ago there was a flourishing Boys' Brigade, with Mr. F. Tyacke, of Treviddo, who did so much for Devoran, as Captain. They used to parade with a Fife and Drum Band.

Mr. Tyacke's daughter, Miss P. M. Tyacke, started a company of Girl Guides in 1917 and was captain of them for about twenty years. She was also County Secretary for the Girl Guides of Cornwall.

There were Wolf Cubs, with Miss R. Edwards, now Mrs. Trim, as Scout Master, and Brownies, with Miss W. Moor, now Mrs. Trezise, as Brown Owl.
