The MyFeock Repair Café which is held from 10am to 11.30am (last items accepted at 11am) generally on the last Tuesday of the month at The Hub Carnon Community Methodist Church. Run by volunteers, there are repairers ready to help you, with the idea to share skills too (where possible and safe to do so).

They hope to fix your garments, textiles, mechanical clocks, soft toys, woodwork and much more! Pop in for a cuppa and get something repaired at the same time! Pension Credit

Before bills go up this winter, if you might be entitled to Pension Credit spend 5 minutes using the Government's online Pension Credit calculator, you could be missing out on an average of £3,900 extra a year.

Pension Credit can provide vital support to low-income pensioner households. It is especially important now that it is linked to winter fuel payments.

Retirees could be eligible for pension credit if they are above state pension age and have an income of less than £218.15 a week, or less than £332.95 as a joint weekly income with a partner. Some pensioners think because they have savings or own their own home they wouldn't get Pension Credit, but they may still be eligible.

Disabled people, those caring for someone, and those with housing costs could still be eligible even if they have more income or savings.

There's help for households.

If you've reached State Pension age and your weekly income is below **£218.15**, or **£332.95** if you live with a partner, you could be eligible for **Pension Credit** – even if you own your home or have savings.

Overgrown hedges

The Parish Council cut the hedges on land that they own and Common Land and will be doing this during October. We are often asked by residents who is responsible for cutting back various hedges across the parish where these are over hanging the pavement or the roads, sometimes causing a hazard to road users. Cornwall Council carry out some roadside verge maintenance but not all. Most hedge cutting along the highway is done by the adjacent landowner, often farmers. Landowners may cut the verge as well as their hedges. Individuals also cut verges in the vicinity of their properties for aesthetic purposes.

Hedge growth or trees on properties next to the highway is generally the responsibility of the landowner. Cornwall Council recommend that regular maintenance of hedgerows is undertaken. Regular maintenance prevents side growth and low-lying branches extending into the road. Landowners must take reasonable care to ensure that trees within falling distance of the highway are safe. This responsibility includes trees rooted in Cornish hedges that form the boundary to the highway.

Work to maintain hedgerows from the road, must be done by an accredited contractor. Contractors must have the required licenses to work on the highway. They must also be familiar with relevant legislation. They should be aware of landscape designations such as Tree Preservation Orders. These can be checked [online](#)

Cornwall Council have the power to ensure landowners resolve problematic vegetation and tree issues. The Council notify landowners under Section 154 of the Highway Act 1980.

To keep all highway users safe and avoid legal action, Cornwall Council ask that the landowner or their contractor:

- reduce side growth back to the edge/boundary of the maintained highway
- ensure at least 2.1m clearance above the surface of footways
- ensure at least 5m clearance above the surface of cycleways
- ensure at least 5.2m clearance above the surface of the highway. This allows high sides vehicles to pass safely
- make sure that branches and vegetation are not in contact with or obstructing highway signs
- remove branches that are in contact with or blocking streetlights
- remove or reduce vegetation that is obscuring visibility at junctions, on bends or passing places

Landowners must also comply with legislation relating to the control of noxious and injurious plants. For example, Japanese Knotweed, Giant Hogweed and Ragwort.

Remember that hedgerows can provide important habitats for birds, mammals, reptiles and insects. Bird nesting season in Cornwall is from the **1st March to the end of September**. However, many species produce additional broods depending upon climate and habitat. Checks should be made for nesting birds before hedge cutting outside the nesting season.

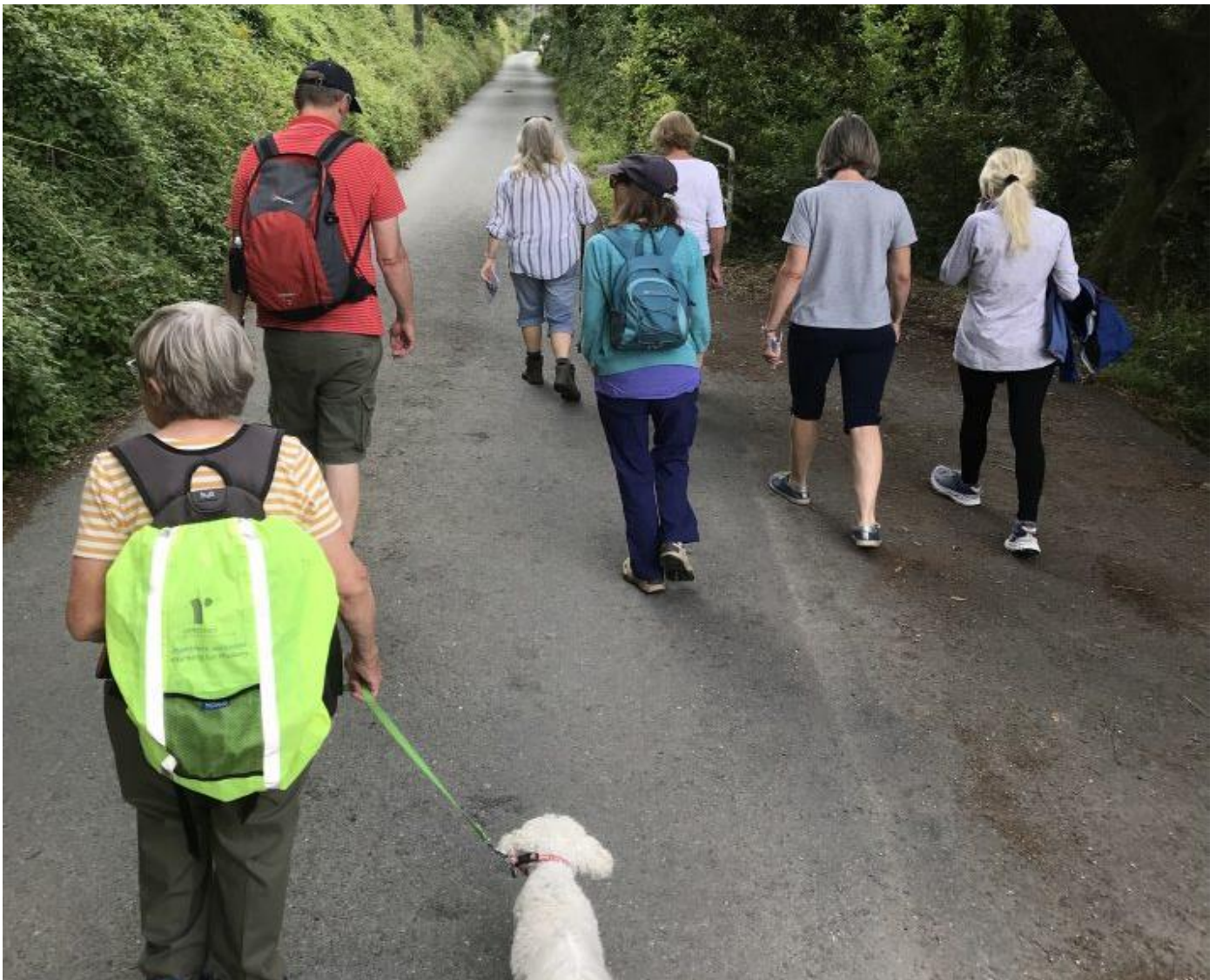


Walk & Talks introduce Active Feock short walks - ‘Feock Strolls’

The MyFeock staple Walk & Talks, launched in August 2021, is introducing short walks in line with Active Feock, our Health & Wellbeing initiative to support the physical and mental health of residents.

The first ‘Feock Stroll’ will be on **Tuesday 22nd October in Devoran starting at 10am from the cycle path car park just off the Carnon Gate roundabout.** The route will be on the flat and suitable for all abilities. Although short in distance the inclusion of pauses for rests and discussion at points of interest will make it a leisurely paced experience compared to our longer, brisker Feock Trails walks.

If you’d like to go along to meet new people and have some company for a stroll why not come along! Dogs on leads are allowed and the group will walk to the pace of the slowest walker so no one will feel rushed.



Rogue Traders and doorstep callers

There have been reports recently across the Parish of door step callers who residents feel are over pricing for work and using pressurised selling methods. Cornwall Council's advice to report a rogue trader is:

If you have evidence of a scam operating in your area, or you are worried about a doorstep trader Cornwall Council would like to hear from you. Their advice is:

- Don't confront them.
- Just get as much information as you can, such as:
 - vehicle description and registration number, business name, what they are selling or the work they are doing, dates and times of the visit, keep hold of any fliers / leaflets they may have given you
- Then email tradingstandards@cornwall.gov.uk or call 0300 1234 191.

Changes to road layout – traffic calming consultation Quenchwell Road in Carnon Downs

It is proposed to install traffic calming on Quenchwell Road on the stretch from the far side of the Garden Centre to The Beeches, the idea is to slow traffic to make it safer for pedestrians to walk on this road to the Garden Centre as there is unfortunately no room to install a pavement by The Beeches, this is something that we know residents have been concerned about for a number of years.

The public consultation will begin on **3rd October 2024** and run for 3 weeks. Residents are encouraged to provide their views on Cornwall Council's website via this link [Welcome to eNgageSpace](#)

Active Feock Update

The Parish Council commissioned a feasibility study for its Active Feock project to look at the priorities of the community and other local stakeholders about how easy it is to get around the parish. The project aims to improve the network within the parish by making improvements to public rights of way and cycle routes, as well as making them more interesting to use and enhancing corridors for wildlife. The overall purpose is to support and enhance the wellbeing of residents. The feasibility study report has now been received and can be read on our [website](#).

The Parish Council agreed at their last meeting to take this project forward and will now be seeking funding for the project, as well as using CIL money that has been earmarked for improvements to public rights of way and cycle routes. The first priority is to put in more rest points for people when out and about and the Council has identified 10 locations for new bench seats across the parish, most of which are on new Feock Strolls walking routes that will also be promoted to encourage people to get out and about.

A plea – please think before leaving your books!

As some of the defibs are located in the phonebox book swaps please only leave books on the shelves, if the shelves are full please take your books to a charity shop – there have been instances of books (and DVDs, jigsaws etc.!) being piled up on the floor of them and in an emergency this makes it harder for someone to reach the defibrillator.

This photo was taken of the Carnon Downs bookswap last year and this is totally unacceptable.

The primary purpose of the phoneboxes is to house the defibrillators and access to them must not be hindered – lives could be put at risk if books are left in such a way to hinder access.

The bookswaps are not places for books (if the shelves are full) or other things you are trying to get rid of to be dumped, they are a community facility provided by the Parish Council and Councillors and volunteers help to keep them tidy but we don't feel it is fair to expect them to have to dispose of surplus books or other items that have been dumped there.

Please have some consideration for others when using these facilities. The Parish Council will be discussing the housing of the defibrillators and provision of bookswaps at their October Access & Amenities Committee meeting.

Please be aware that Cornwall Council no longer display yellow site notices on planning application sites unless they affect a public right of way, listed building or are in a Conservation Area so to be aware of what is going on in the area check our Current Planning Applications page or set up an alert on Cornwall Council's planning page as shown on the next page.

If you're thinking of making a planning application on your property we always recommend that applicants read our Feock Neighbourhood Development Plan to make themselves aware of the local planning policies. Vacancies on the Parish Council

Would you like to make a difference? Devoran ward (2 positions)

Feock Parish Council has two vacancies in Devoran ward for Parish Councillors, which is hoped to fill by co-option at the November meeting. All Councillors terms will end in May 2025 when the 4 yearly local elections for all Town and Parish Councils will be held.

There is so much to get involved in from reviewing planning applications, helping with making improvements to footpaths and recreation areas, highways issues and our wellbeing work to name but a few! You will also be required to attend the Parish Council meetings which generally take place on the first or second Monday evening of the month in Devoran, you can also join other Committees such as Planning and Access & Amenities if you wish.

To become a Councillor you must:

- Be a British or a citizen of the Commonwealth. You may also be eligible as a citizen of the European Union, however the criteria has changed now that the UK has left the European Union. Please check on the gov.uk website for advice about EU citizens' voting and candidacy rights in local elections; and be at least 18 years old.
- be an elector of the parish; or
- in the past 12 months have occupied (as owner or tenant) land or other premises in the parish; or
- work in the parish (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the parish boundary.

Please note, being a Parish Councillor is a voluntary position and we would recommend people who are interested attend a Parish Council or Committee meeting before applying to gain an understanding of the issues you will be involved with.

The next meetings are: Monday 7th October (Planning) – 4pm, Monday 14th October (Full Council) – 6pm and Monday 28th October (Access & Amenities Committee) - 6pm.

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please send an email or letter of application explaining why you would like to join the Parish Council, what you can bring to the Council and any previous relevant experience, to the Parish Clerk by **Wednesday 6th November 2024**. 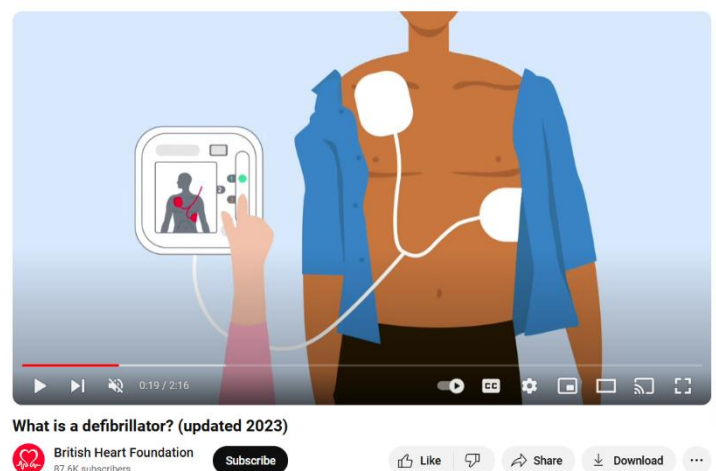


Defibrillators in the Parish

There are a number of public access defibrillators around the parish, these are automated, anyone can use one, training is not necessary. The defibrillator will talk the user through how to use it and will not allow a shock to be given unless it detects that the heart is in a shockable rhythm. The defibrillators are located as follows:
